Mandatory Mask Wearing - Effective Monday, August 24th, Government has made it mandatory that face masks be worn in all public places. Therefore, face masks must be worn by everyone entering, and moving around in church. When you are seated and are physically distanced (6 ft apart), you can remove your face mask until you leave your seat at Communion time and then again when leaving the church. Thank you for your cooperation.

Mass Intentions - Since the COVID-19 outbreak in March there have not been a lot of Mass intentions requested or Mass Cards sold. Because of this we will be reducing the number of intentions for each weekday Mass at St. Kevin's Parish to 2 instead of 3. If you would like to request a Mass for a loved one, to be said on a weekday, now would be an opportune time. You can request an intention by phone, email or dropping by the Parish Office when open to the public (1 - 4pm Monday - Thursday & 9 - 12 noon on Fridays). Or you can place your intention & money in an envelope and drop it in the mail slot of the Parish Office door.

Weekday Mass - Weekday Mass has resumed at St. Kevin's Parish on Tuesday evening at 7 pm and Thursday morning at 10 am. The church doors will open 15 minutes prior to Mass time and contact information will be taken at the door.

Parish Office Reopening - The Parish Office is now open to the public from 1 - 4 pm, Monday to Thursday and 9 am - 12 Noon on Fridays. At this time visits to the office will be by appointment only. Please call the Parish Office and you will be given a time to drop by.
