JOINING OUR PARISH

We welcome all who seek a spiritual home in our Catholic community. Introduce yourself to the pastor and he will help you join our parish. If you are not baptized, or are baptized in another Christian tradition and seek full communion with the Catholic Church, consider the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults process. It begins with inquiry sessions in which you can ask questions and discuss issues with other seekers. The process continues with opportunities for learning and spiritual transformation. The RCIA also serves baptized Catholics who did not have the opportunity to receive Holy Communion and Confirmation. The Director of Religious Education will help you start.

BAPTISM

If you are parents seeking baptism for your child, please introduce yourself to the pastor after Mass. He wishes to meet you in person before making an appointment for baptism preparation.

MARRIAGE

Our pastor invites engaged couples to make an appointment with him at least six months prior to marriage, before setting a wedding date. Couples are welcome to call as soon as you decide to marry or even while you are still considering whether to go forward toward marriage.



Jesus: The Way, the Truth, and the Life

A Powerful Study on the Life of Jesus Christ

Jesus: The Way, the Truth, and the Life is a 10-week video study program and book. Anchored in the life of Christ as presented in the Gospels, this study explores the entirety of Jesus' life—who he is, what he is really like, what he taught, what he did for our salvation, and what all of this means for us as Catholics today.

Presented by Dr. Marcellino D'Ambrosio, Jeff Cavins, and Dr. Edward Sri, this study was filmed in the Holy Land so Catholics can experience the extraordinary world in which Jesus lived and taught—the historical context, the politics, the clashing cultures, the history, and the ancient land—and see where the most significant events of his life took place, from his infancy to his ascension.

This study shows, in a simple way, how Jesus, the Incarnate God, is both fully divine and fully human—his intimacy with the Father, his revelation of the Father's love, and his extraordinary influence on his disciples, his followers, and even his enemies.

Most importantly, this encounter with Christ will inspire and empower you to center your entire life in him as you come to know and love him in an ever-deeper and more intimate way.



LIVE STREAMED MASSES

To reach the live-stream (or video) Mass quickly, click the gold *floating* "Mass Times & Directions" button. Look for the Mass with a tiny gold arrow button next to it (5:00 pm and after); click the arrow to go to the page with the live-stream or video.

TIPS TO RETURN TO MASS

Please fill in the front pews first. This is so that no one walks past you and on weekdays it will eliminate pews that have to be sanitized. Please stay single file and 6' apart at all times.



At St. Pius: Two people together can sit on the ends of the pews by the windows and up to three together on the isle side. Sit from the blue circle and over to the end (not in the middle). Parties of four or more must take up the whole pew and may sit in the middle.

At Corpus Christi: Up to four people together can sit on the ends of the pews by the windows and up to three people can sit together on the isle end. Multiple people together sit from the blue circles over to the end. Only one person can sit in the middle. If there are more than four people you have to spread out to middle blue circle.

Please go up the center isle and Father will take you where it will be private and able to keep six foot distance. Return to the Church by exiting the side door and coming back in the main entrance.
