OCTOBER IS ROSARY MONTH

The feast of the Holy Rosary was Oct. 7. In PREP we are focusing on the Hail Mary for this month. Each child in PREP will be given a little prayer card of this prayer to the Virgin Mary. Please help them learn it. Pray it in the morning, on the way to school, at bedtime.

Praying prayers is the best way to 'learn' them. Where did the 'Hail Mary' come from? Actually, we owe the first half of it to the angel Gabriel and to Mary's cousin Elizabeth. "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with thee," are the words of the angel when he greets Mary at the Annunciation (Luke 1:28). During the visitation, Mary's cousin Elizabeth welcomes her with the words, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." (Luke 1:42). The joining of the two salutations in prayer appears to have become a widespread practice in the mid-eleventh century, though there is evidence of it showing up in eastern rites as far back as the sixth century. As for the second half of the prayer, to whom does Jesus listen to most? His Mom!

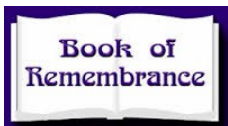


All Souls Triduum of Masses: Please remember all your deceased loved ones in our annual triduum (three) of Masses which will be offered for their intentions.
