- Signs of physical abuse (cuts, bruises, etc.)
- Unexplained school absences or truancy
- Brags about making or having lots of money or displays expensive clothing/accessories
- New tattoo (often used as a brand)
- Older boyfriend, new friends with a different lifestyle, or gang involvement
- Uncharacteristically disengaged from family
- Sexualized behavior
- Withdrawn, depressed, or distracted

Signs of Labor Trafficking

- Excessive daily work hours
- Signs of physical or psychological abuse
- Reports of work place harassment
- Inability or fear to leave job
- Overcrowded or unsafe work conditions
- Legal threats of deportation
- Passport/legal documents taken away
- No housing contract
- No control over his or her own money
- Freedom of movement is restricted



11. "Each in his or her own way" the Council says. We should not grow discouraged before examples of holiness that appear unattainable. There are some testimonies that may prove helpful and inspiring, but that we are not meant to copy, for that could even lead us astray from the one specific path that the Lord has in mind for us. The important thing is that each believer discern his or her own path, that they bring out the very best of themselves, the most personal gifts that God has placed in their hearts (cf. 1 Cor 12:7), rather than hopelessly trying to imitate something not meant for them. We are all called to be witnesses, but there are many actual ways of bearing witness.[11] Indeed, when the great mystic, Saint John of the Cross, wrote his Spiritual Canticle, he preferred to avoid hard and fast rules for all. He explained that his verses were composed so that everyone could benefit from them "in his or her own way".[12] For God's life is communicated "to some in one way and to others in another".[13]

12. Within these various forms, I would stress too that the "genius of woman" is seen in feminine

11. «Cada uno por su camino», dice el Concilio. Entonces, no se trata de desalentarse cuando uno contempla modelos de santidad que le parecen inalcanzables. Hay testimonios que son útiles para estimularnos y motivarnos, pero no para que tratemos de copiarlos, porque eso hasta podría alejarnos del camino único y diferente que el Señor tiene para nosotros. Lo que interesa es que cada crevente discierna su propio camino y saque a la luz lo mejor de sí, aquello tan personal que Dios ha puesto en él (cf. 1 Co 12, 7), y no que se desgaste intentando imitar algo que no ha sido pensado para él. Todos estamos llamados a ser testigos, pero «existen muchas formas existenciales de testimonio»[11]. reflejar la santidad de Dios en este mundo. Precisamente, aun en épocas en que las mujeres fueron más relegadas, el Espíritu Santo suscitó santas cuya fascinación provocó nuevos dinamismos espirituales e importantes reformas en la Iglesia. Podemos mencionar a santa Hildegarda de Bingen, santa Brígida, santa Catalina de Siena, santa Teresa de Ávila o santa Teresa de Lisieux. Pero me interesa recordar a tantas mujeres desconocidas u olvidadas quienes, cada una a su modo, han sostenido y transformado familias y comunidades con la potencia de su testimonio.
