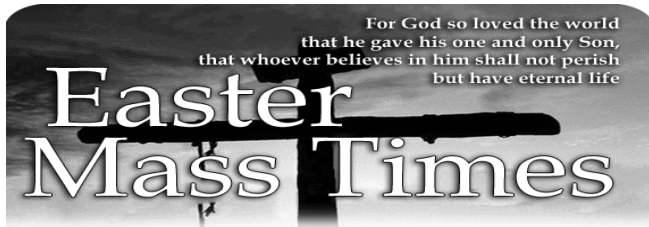

FAMILY IDEAS

Renewed and strengthened by our time together at Mass, we go out to live as Jesus Christ showed us. The word MASS comes from a Latin word meaning 'sending'. We are sent from Mass to announce the good news of Jesus Christ. Our words, our actions, and our example of faith show people who Jesus Christ is in our lives.

As the primary teachers of your children in the ways of faith, you teach them about God's love in the ordinary moments of daily life. When you tenderly tuck them in at night, when you listen to what they say, and when you care for them, you show God's love to your children.

Continue to spend time together after Sunday Mass. Go for a walk, play a game together, look at family pictures, or call or Skype other family members. In this way we make Sundays special family days.

FAMILY PRAYER

Jesus, Teacher and Redeemer, you are the light of the world and the light of our lives. Help our family to walk always in the light and show your light to others. May we be people of compassion who witness to your love by the way we live each day. Amen.

NOTE TO FIRST COMMUNION FAMILIES

Teach empathy to your first Communion child by asking questions such as: How would you feel if there were no doctors to go to if you were sick? What would it be like if you were hungry and there was no food to eat? How do you think children feel who live in a refugee camp? This helps children become more aware of the feelings of others. Just be sure you also are able to show the child ways to help out the situation.

A CALL TO HOLINESS BY POPE FRANCIS.

58. Not infrequently, contrary to the promptings of the Spirit, the life of the Church can become a museum piece or the possession of a select few. This can occur when some groups of Christians give excessive importance to certain rules, customs or ways of acting. The Gospel then tends to be reduced and constricted, deprived of its simplicity, allure and savour. This may well be a subtle form of pelagianism, for it appears to subject the life of grace to certain human structures. It can affect groups, movements and communities, and it explains why so often they begin with an intense life in the Spirit, only to end up fossilized... or corrupt.

59. Once we believe that everything depends on human effort as channelled by ecclesial rules and structures, we unconsciously complicate the Gospel and become enslaved to a blueprint that leaves few openings for the working of grace. Saint Thomas Aquinas reminded us that the precepts added to the Gospel by the Church should be imposed with moderation "lest the conduct of the faithful become burdensome", for then our religion would become a form of servitude.[\[64\]](#)

58. Muchas veces, en contra del impulso del Espíritu, la vida de la Iglesia se convierte en una pieza de museo o en una posesión de pocos. Esto ocurre cuando algunos grupos cristianos dan excesiva importancia al cumplimiento de determinadas normas propias, costumbres o estilos. De esa manera, se suele reducir y encorsetar el Evangelio, quitándole su sencillez cautivante y su sal. Es quizás una forma sutil de pelagianismo, porque parece someter la vida de la gracia a unas estructuras humanas. Esto afecta a grupos, movimientos y comunidades, y es lo que explica por qué tantas veces comienzan con una intensa vida en el Espíritu, pero luego terminan fosilizados... o corruptos.

59. Sin darnos cuenta, por pensar que todo depende del esfuerzo humano encauzado por normas y estructuras eclesiales, complicamos el Evangelio y nos volvemos esclavos de un esquema que deja pocos resquicios para que la gracia actúe. Santo Tomás de Aquino nos recordaba que los preceptos añadidos al Evangelio por la Iglesia deben exigirse con moderación «para no hacer pesada la vida a los fieles», porque así «se convertiría nuestra religión en una esclavitud»[\[64\]](#).
