Note from Fr. Tom:

Faithfully living the life of a disciple requires great trust in a God who can seem distant or even absent, depending on the circumstances of our lives. Sometimes we create the distance by giving priority to the distractions of the world, and sometimes tragic events beyond our control can cause us to doubt God's presence. Maintaining steadfast faith requires dedicated care and attention to our relationship with God. Jesus' example and the power of the Holy Spirit provide us the strength and guidance we need to remain ready to meet him when he comes again.

In today's Gospel Jesus teaches us to be ready for the kingdom. The people of Jesus' day expected it soon, and the earliest Christians did too. Certain groups throughout the centuries have tried to pinpoint the exact day and time it would take place. But Jesus told us clearly no one knows when it will be, so we must always be ready, since we don't want to be left out.

Jesus uses two examples to illustrate the need for readiness of the coming kingdom. The first one was with a master who had servant slaves went to a wedding celebration. Jesus used a wedding celebration as an example, because no one knew when it would end, sometimes for days. It probably depended on how long the supply of wine lasted! In that culture a master would never be a table waiter for his servants. What Jesus is telling us by this image is that those who are ready for the kingdom will be blessed beyond their wildest expectations. The second example of the thief also dwells on this idea of uncertainty. No one knows when a thief might come, so we must be prepared. These parables were meant to shore up our end-time expectations. I'm sure our Lord will find all you good people awaiting and alert for his return.
