Discipleship and Renouncement of Possessions

Disciples are followers of Jesus Christ who believe in His teachings and messages. These disciples pass the “cafeteria faith” or ‘living in the surface faith’ and live and model in their lives the Christian faith. In today’s Gospel from Luke 14:25-33, Jesus speaks about possessions that people are attached to. Living a prestigious life and complacent in it, while dismissing the call of becoming His disciples in the world is the attention we need to adhere to.

It sounds like a harsh saying of hating mother and father, wife and children, brothers and sisters and even our own lives cannot be Jesus’ disciples. The point is driven crystal clear: Surrender.

Most if not all of the human race, need to surrender to the will of God. The foundation of everyone’s life and faith is from God. Most people do not serve God. They don’t know about Him or they don’t want to hear or know about Him. Yet, He is still calling and inviting us to live and abide in His life.

I believe most of the parents want the best for their children and do everything for them by giving them I-pods, I-pads and all different kind of brands of clothes and shoes. But what is missing is the spiritual well being of their children, the big BUT in the children’s life. Life in God!

In order for us to prepare at all times before closing our physical eyes forever in this world before we see God, we need to obey His Commandment. The Gospel of John states for us the solemn words of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. “I know that you are my friends if you remain in me. Whoever eats my body and drinks my blood will have life in me,” says the Lord.

How do we become Jesus’ disciples? Why should we renounce possessions? To answer the first question, Catholics must always honor the Sabbath, which is Sunday. Every Catholic should nourish and nurture their hearts and souls from the Sacrament of the Eucharist. It is God’s greatest gift to all of the human race and to His bride the Church. Live a life of virtues. Stay away from vices and malicious conversations. Pray and help one another with kindness and in works of mercy.

To answer the second question of how we should renounce possessions: give to the poor, donate more to your parish and church as a good steward. Get involved in the ministries of the parish and the church. Pray together as a family. Parents and children should go together as a family to Mass. Read the Holy Bible to your children. Bring the children to Faith Formation and be involved in their faith journey.

Therefore, brothers and sisters – once we surrender to the will of God and abandon selfish ways, prejudices of all kinds, self-serve attitudes, and rely on our complacencies, sure we have a chance to follow and serve Jesus with pure hearts. Amen.

INFANT BAPTISM: Parents must be registered and regularly attending the Sunday Eucharist to begin Baptism preparation. Baptismal Preparation is held quarterly. Call the parish office to for next scheduled date. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the first and third Sunday of every month.

MARRIAGE: If one of the engaged couple (or their parents) is registered at St. Mary's arrangements may be made personally by the couple at least six months in advance. 8-10 months is preferred.

SICK CALLS: We are happy to visit the sick and bring Communion to them. Please notify the parish office.

ANNULMENT PROCESS: If you are contemplating filing for an annulment; know that it is a healing process. It takes up to 18 months for the Tribunal to complete each case, so please take that into consideration. Call the parish office for more information.
