
**INFANT BAPTISM:** Parents must be registered and regularly attending the Sunday Eucharist to begin Baptism preparation. Baptismal Preparation is held by appointment. Call the parish office to schedule a date. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the first and third Sunday of every month.

**MARRIAGE:** If one of the engaged couple (or their parents) is registered at St. Mary's arrangements may be made personally by the couple at least six months in advance. 8-10 months is preferred.

**SICK CALLS:** We are happy to visit the sick and bring Communion to them. Please notify the parish office.

**ANNULMENT PROCESS:** If you are contemplating filing for an annulment; know that it is a healing process. It takes up to 18 months for the Tribunal to complete each case, so please take that into consideration. Call the parish office for more information.

**FROM THE PASTOR**

**Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life? (Mark 10:17-30).**

We heard from the holy Gospel according to Luke this Sunday the important issues of gaining wealth versus discipleship. The story of a young rich man who asked Jesus what he must do to inherit eternal life.

Jesus didn't give to the young man an easy yes or no answer. He laid out the rest of the Ten Commandments before the young man. The young man responded he observed all the commandment from his youth. Then, Jesus sees through the young man's soul ("*Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said to him*"), told him, "*You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.*"

The rich man "*face fell,*" "*went away sad,*" for he had many possessions.

We have heard from Jesus talking about the difficulty of entering the Kingdom of God and His promises about the rewards due to discipleship. Wealth and material goods were considered a sign of God's favor. Jesus response shocks the disciples because it contradicts customary principle. Wealth and power generated false security and Jesus rejects them. Salvation depends solely on the goodness of God, who offers it as a gift.

The rich man agreed that obedience to the word of the Law is not enough, but "what more must I do?"— suggests that he thinks of it in terms of achievement. Entry to new life is not a matter of merit. It is eventually a matter of divine grace, entrance in God's kingdom is impossible for anyone who depends on his or her material possessions. After all, a wealthy person finds that discipleship is more costly than wealth.

For those who give up everything will be rewarded. Rewards will come from those who give up family and possessions, they will experience a new family, the Church. The things they give up to surrendered for the Lord, and His ministry and share in the works of salvation will assure their faithful stewards as the Lord's disciples.

Therefore, the Lord blesses us with His abundance and graces so that we will share it for the good of His bride, the Church, and the people of goodwill. The Lord demands discipleship from us all. We have to follow the Lord and step up to the task to live our faith in actions by giving and sharing what we have for the building up of His mystical body, the Church. Amen.

## NEXT SUNDAY—WORLD MISSION SUNDAY

Next Sunday is World Mission Sunday, a special day on which we unite ourselves with Catholics all over the world to pray and sacrifice for the missionary efforts of the Church.

This Sunday, the Church will canonize Pope Paul VI who gave us the word “evangelize” in his Apostolic Exhortation, “Announcing the Gospel.” In this work he wrote, *“For the Church, evangelizing means bringing the Good News into the strata of humanity, and through its influence transferring humanity from within and making it new.”*

On this same day Salvadorian Archbishop Oscar Romero will be canonized. He was martyred for the faith and for the cause of justice.

These two events and celebrating the missionary activity of the Church gives us a great segue to the following weeks during which we will explain and encourage our people to “**Unleash the Gospel**” and its program.

The observance of World Mission Sunday is truly “worldly” as prayers and support of the missionary work of the Church is done in every parish church and chapel throughout the entire world. All Catholics respond to the request for this special day by our Holy Father who has asked the Pontifical Society for the Propagation of the Faith to plan and promote this holy work of “First Evangelization.”

This week you have received special envelopes from the Society for the Propagation of the Faith for the **mission collection to be taken next weekend**. It is suggested that families contribute for the missions at this time, thus enrolling themselves in the Society as well as offering substantial help to our missionaries who spread the gospel.

**Do be generous in supporting the Pontifical Mission Sunday for the Propagation of the Faith which is the Church’s principal means of spreading the gospel throughout the world.**



## Vets Returning Home Story

Vets Returning Home is a nonprofit and non-government funded organization dedicated to helping our veterans transition into stable lives. The goal of Vets Returning Home is simple: to end chronic homelessness among veterans in our communities. Our mission is complex, requiring more than putting a roof over the veterans’ heads. It requires an approach that addresses the “total veteran” and his needs and making sure they succeed after they are transitioned. We are a volunteer operated 11,000 square foot facility with 43 beds and commercial kitchen. We provide a stable and sober living environment to veterans in crisis. Onsite services including employment readiness training, aid with job placement, disability benefit connection, legal support and life skills training. Community support both physical and financial has been vital to our ability to continue our mission. Vets Returning Home receives NO government funding. We have successfully transitioned on average 140 veterans a year back into society as a fully functioning community member. In our 5 years of operation, we have housed over 960 veterans on site and helped well over 300 veterans and veterans families off site. We have provided vehicles (with free and clear titles) to 29 veterans, and provided household furnishings to over 150 veterans and families, and so much more. This was accomplished with no government funding. We could not keep our doors open without the generous help and loving support of the community around the Vets Returning Home Facility.
