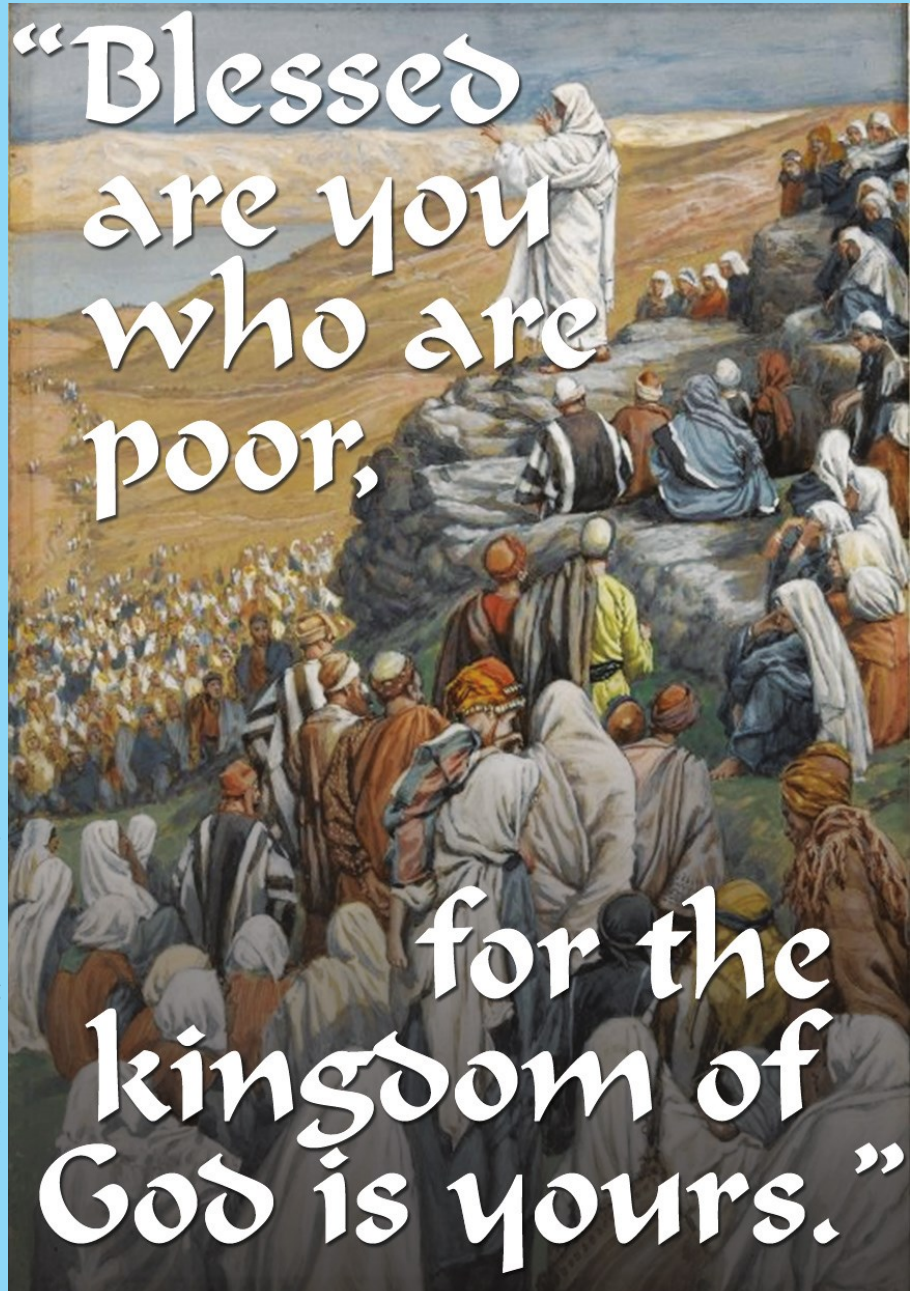
INFANT BAPTISM: Parents must be registered and regularly attending the Sunday Eucharist to begin Baptism preparation. Baptismal Preparation is held by appointment. Call the parish office to schedule a date. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the first and third Sunday of every month.

MARRIAGE: If one of the engaged couple (or their parents) is registered at St. Mary's arrangements may be made personally by the couple at least six months in advance. 8-10 months is preferred.

SICK CALLS: We are happy to visit the sick and bring Communion to them. Please notify the parish office.

ANNULMENT PROCESS: If you are contemplating filing for an annulment; know that it is a healing process. It takes up to 18 months for the Tribunal to complete each case, so please take that into consideration. Call the parish office for more information.

FROM THE PASTOR

Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose hope is the Lord, (Jeremiah 17:5-8).

Hope does not disappointed. Trust is confidence. These two words are always in the vocabulary of our human language. Hope and trust are very important words in our first reading from the Prophet Jeremiah.

The prophet states the Lord speaking to His people. It relates to our life dependency, which are the material things that we are using in the world. Tangible things that somehow not lasting only temporary, even though it serves us. Yet, the point of it is that, we are relying on such material things more. We tend to forget who provides and gives us all what we need.

Yes, we must trust God and put our hopes in His divine love. Why? It is His life we breathe, move and have our being. Without God's life we are not able to go to work, do our groceries, raise children, hunt or farm to say the least.

On the contrary, today's holy Gospel according to Luke, he states Jesus together with His Twelve apostles including foreigners, he addresses those who suffer misfortune: poverty, hunger, sorrow, and persecution. Jesus speaks of the reign of God transforming human reality but also implies a change of status for those who reject it. No one is excluded from the reign of God. Our bad attitudes contributes to the misfortune of others. The life of the blessed and the cursed depends on how they use and distribute wealth and treat each other.

The Lord's reign presents itself in poverty. He identifies Himself with the poor, the hungry, homeless, prisoners: "Whatever they did to one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me" (Matthew 25:40). God looks at our helplessness and sent His only Son to show us the way, the truth, and the life of His reign. He enters the life of those who are poor and teaches us the value of life we must live. Therefore, we know we are the children of God as people who cares for others and one another. We put our trust in our Lord for He always provides and blesses us with His divine grace. Our hope is in the Lord, who make heaven and earth. Jesus is the reason of our being in communion with God and with one another. Let us build together the reign of God with love and mercy, worship and thanksgiving in celebrating the Eucharist, and always do cooperate and works of mercy in solidarity with His bride the Church. Amen.
