PARISH MEMBERSHIP: We joyfully welcome new members to our parish. Please register at the parish office during business hours. We also ask that you let us know if you plan to move from the parish.

INFANT BAPTISM: Parents must be registered and regularly attending the Sunday Eucharist to begin Baptism preparation. Baptismal Preparation is held by appointment. Call the parish office to schedule a date. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the first and third Sunday of every month.

MARRIAGE: If one of the engaged couple (or their parents) is registered at St. Mary's arrangements may be made personally by the couple at least six months in advance. 8-10 months is preferred.

SICK CALLS: We are happy to visit the sick and bring Communion to them. Please notify the parish office.

ANNULMENT PROCESS: If you are contemplating filing for an annulment; know that it is a healing process. It takes up to 18 months for the Tribunal to complete each case, so please take that into consideration. Call the parish office for more information.

FROM THE PASTOR

The Lord Is Risen, Alleluia, and He is Risen Indeed, Alleluia, Alleluia!
I will praise you, Lord, for You have rescued me, (Psalm 30:2,4,5-6,11-12,13).

The scene was at the Sea of Tiberias. There the Lord revealed Himself to His disciples for the third time. Jesus disciples were working the whole night and they didn't have a catch. They heard a voice of someone calling out, they did not realize that it was Jesus.

"Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something." They cast it and they hardly put it in the boat because of the number of fish.

The beloved disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord."

In our journey of life, it seems that all the stress of life dull of our vision to see and to hear the Lord at our presence. Getting frustrated and discouraged always distract us from achieving our vision, goals, and plans. Whirlwinds of times and circumstances sway us like a torturing sea current. An easy give up and throwing the towel is our last resort. Perhaps Peter, Thomas, Nathanael, sons of Zebedee's and the disciples were exhausted, hungry, and ready to give up.

Then, perhaps the beloved disciple, was praying and talking to Jesus in silence for a good catch. He said to Peter, "It is the Lord." The Lord's name is hope, life, love, belief, faith, truth, way. Peter jumped into the sea to get to Jesus on the shore. Jesus prepared the breakfast of fish and bread for his disciples. Jesus said, "Bring some of the fish you just caught."

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus asked Peter three times (as we recalled Peter denying Jesus three times), *Simon, son of John, do you love me more these?* Simon Peter responded, *Yes, Lord, you know that I love you.* Jesus said, **Feed my lambs.** For a second time, *Simon, son of John, do you love me?* Peter answered, *Yes, Lord, you know that I love you.* Jesus said, **Tend my sheep.** For the third time, Jesus said to Peter, *Simon, son of John, do you love me?* Peter was distressed that Jesus asked him a third time, *Do you love me?* Peter answered, "*Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.* Jesus said to Peter, **Feed my sheep.**

Holy Mother Church is making sure that we are fed constantly with the Bread of Life, Jesus Christ, our Lord and God at all the time. Joining our Mass and the Eucharist celebration is Jesus feeding us, His holy lambs, with His own sacred body and blood. Fish and bread that Jesus shared with His apostles at their breakfast is the prototype of the Eucharist. Jesus invites us to join in the celebration of His Easter glory, *Bring some of the fish you just caught,* Jesus says. Our celebration of the Eucharist is a sharing with each other God's gifts of His life and love with another. Let's follow Jesus and answer His call to unleash His Gospel and share His life as a joyful missionary disciple. Amen.
