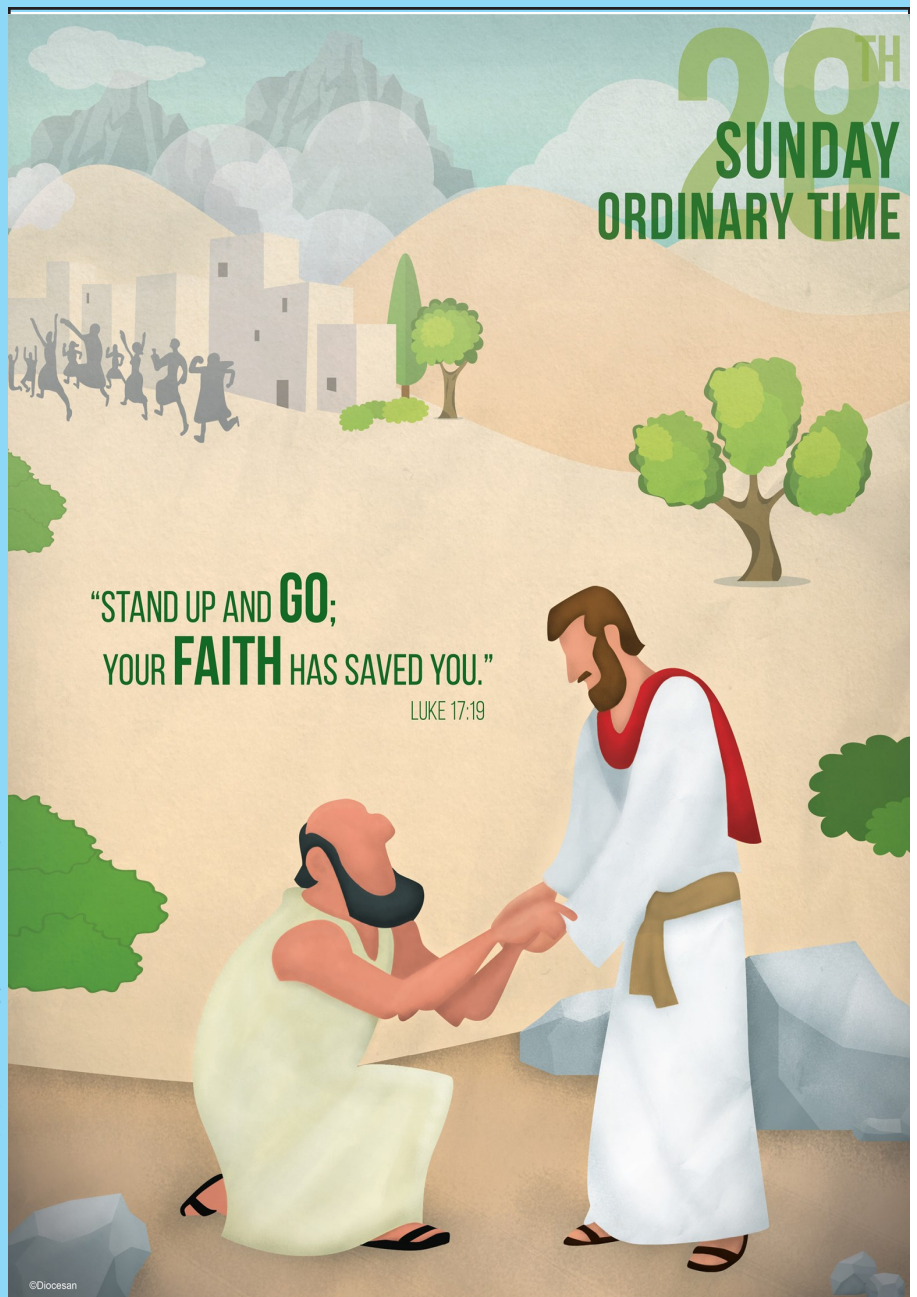
INFANT BAPTISM: Parents must be registered and regularly attending the Sunday Eucharist to begin Baptism preparation. Baptismal Preparation is held by appointment. Call the parish office to schedule a date. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the first and third Sunday of every month.

MARRIAGE: If one of the engaged couple (or their parents) is registered at St. Mary's arrangements may be made personally by the couple at least six months in advance. 8-10 months is preferred.

SICK CALLS: We are happy to visit the sick and bring Communion to them. Please notify the parish office.

ANNULMENT PROCESS: If you are contemplating filing for an annulment; know that it is a healing process. It takes up to 18 months for the Tribunal to complete each case, so please take that into consideration. Call the parish office for more information.

FROM THE PASTOR

SKEPTICISM

How many of us who are skeptical in our faith and trust in Jesus? Are there members of our family, faith community, and nation who are not only skeptical but critical in anything and about in everything? Is your skepticism leads you to negativity and lose your identity as a child of God? Today's first reading from the 2 Kings 5:14-17, took us to the story of Naaman, a Gentile, whose skepticism in the face of the prophet's command leads him to believe. The focus is on the moment of healing. Elisha the prophet, selfless in the midst of Naaman's gratitude reminds us of the story of last week about the servant's response. He was only doing what was required. Overwhelmed by the power of God at work in his life, Naaman promises to worship God alone.

On the contrary, today's reading from the holy Gospel of Luke, Jesus continue His healing ministry of hope to the people. These lepers in the story had faith in Jesus' power to cure them and obedient to His instructions. A priest would have to declare them clean before they could reenter the Israelite community. Realizing that he had been healed, one returned to thank Jesus before going to the priest.

Special moment and important moment of just believing is all it takes. For us, not to doubt the providence and blessings of the Lord, is a total trust that God will accomplish all things in and through us. Whenever we are in doubt, prayers and pondering God's presence in our lives is all we can do. With the intercession of Mother Mary's prayers brings us the courage to know the difference and help us put things into perspective. When it comes to faith in God, we must never be skeptical and unbelieving in the world of the unknown because God is in our midst and is with us – Emmanuel—God is with us. God bless!
