From the Pastors Desk



The Feast of Corpus Christi

We are called to be a living Eucharist!

History: In the year 1263 a German priest from Prague was on route to Rome making a pilgrimage asking God for help to strengthen his faith. He is described as being a pious priest, but one who found it difficult to believe that Christ was actually present in the consecrated Host. Along the way he stopped in a Bolsena 70 miles north of Rome. While celebrating Mass there, as he raised the host during the consecration, the bread turned into flesh and began to bleed. The drops of blood fell onto the small white cloth on the altar, called the corporal. The following year, 1264, Pope Urban IV instituted the feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus today's feast Corpus Christi. The Pope asked St Thomas Aquinas, living at that time, to write hymns for the feast and he wrote two, better known to the older members of our congregation, the Tantum Ergo and O Salutaris. That blood-stained corporal has been reverently enshrined and exhibited in the Basilica of Orvieto north of Rome.

The purpose: (1) we need to thank Jesus for his abiding presence with us. As Jesus promised to be with us until the end of time (Matthew 28:20), as Jesus also said, "Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them." Jesus makes his everlasting presence through Eucharist. (2) We need to thank Jesus for his life giving sacrament of Eucharist. Jesus said, "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day" (John 6:53-54). Through this sacrament of the Eucharist, we will have life here on earth and in heaven. (3) We are called to deepen our faith and experience the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist on this feast of Body and Blood of Christ.

Theological significance: Vatican II documents state that "the Holy Eucharist is the source and summit or the center and culmination of Christian life." Why? 1) Because it enables us to participate in Christ's sacrifice as a present reality for us to benefit from it 2) Because it gives us a lasting memorial of Christ's suffering, death and resurrection, reminding us of our obligation to make loving sacrifices for others. 3) Jesus replaces the Old Covenant with the New Covenant by means of his sacramental body and blood and by which he unites us with God. Because of this theological significance we celebrate the Eucharist because Jesus told us to do so: "Do this in memory of me."

A living Eucharist: St. Augustine says, "When we receive the Body and Blood of Christ in communion, we become what we eat and drink," That's why we call the Eucharist "Holy Communion" because when we eat the body and blood of Christ, we become spiritually one with Jesus. We call it "Holy Mass" because it gives us a Mission "To go in peace to love and serve others." Therefore our participation in the Eucharistic celebration demands that we should share the same self-giving love and sacrifice that we experience in the Eucharist in our families, with one another in the society. In other words, as we receive the Holy Communion, let us become Christ-bearers or conveyers of Christ to others at home, in the workplace, and through our simple love, mercy, forgiveness, and humble service every day. That's how we become the living body and blood of Jesus Christ.
