Holy Father's Intention for September 2016

Universal: Centrality of the Human Person

That each may contribute to the common good and to the building of a society that places the human person at the center.

Evangelization: Mission to Evangelize

That by participating in the Sacraments and meditating on Scripture, Christians may become more aware of their mission to evangelize.

The Path of Virtue (3) Justice

Based on Tim Gray and Curtis Martin's Boys to Men: The Transforming Power of Virtue

1. Definition: "Justice consists in the firm and constant will to give God and neighbor their due" (CCC # 1836).
2. Reversal of perspective. Today we tend to be preoccupied with "What is owed me?" rather than considering what I owe others or God. While there is nothing wrong with calling for justice when one is wronged, we should note that in a Christian culture we should be more concerned with others rather than ourselves.
3. God. The most important area of justice, known as the virtue of religion, is that which is owed to God. Worship is the reverence and adoration given to God alone as Creator and Savior (CCC # 2703).
4. Work. Work is central to our vocation. It was given to us *before* the Fall. Therefore it is not a curse but best understood as a sacrifice pleasing to God. It is also a gift to be able to help those less fortunate than ourselves (especially the poor). Therefore our employer deserves our best effort. Being lazy or "killing time" is an injustice to our employer and an offense against our God.
5. Family. Work is good, but if family and friends and God are neglected as a result of our work, it can be a serious fault. Greed could also be a temptation that would cause us to put work above all else. Within the family each member must give to the rest of the family what is due them. This is particularly true between spouses.
6. Truthfulness. Truthfulness is a subvirtue of justice. We may not misrepresent the truth in our relations with others. "Truthfulness keeps to the just mean between what ought to be expressed and what ought to be kept secret: it entails honesty and discretion (CCC #2469).
7. Justice and Mercy. Justice should always be accompanied by mercy. Without attention to mercy, justice can easily become oppressive. When justice is transformed by supernatural grace, we can recognize that what others need and what is required of us take on an eternal dimension.

Sobre la base de Tim Gray y Curtis Martin, From Boys to Men, The Transforming Power of Virtue

1. Definición: "La justicia consiste en la voluntad firme y constante de dar a Dios y al prójimo que les es debido" (CIC # 1836).
2. La inversión de perspectiva. Hoy en día se tiende a estar preocupado por el "¿Por qué me debe?" en lugar de considerar lo que le debo a otros y a Dios. Aunque no hay nada malo en pedir justicia, debemos señalar que en una cultura cristiana que deberíamos estar más preocupados por los demás más que a nosotros mismos.
3. Dios! El área más importante de la justicia, conocida como la virtud de la religión, es la que se le debe a Dios. La adoración es la reverencia y adoración reservada a Dios como Creador y Salvador (CIC # 2703).
4. Trabajar. El trabajo es el centro de nuestra vocación. Se le ha dado a nosotros antes de la caída. Por lo tanto, no es una maldición, pero entiende mejor como un sacrificio agradable a Dios. También es un regalo para ser capaz de ayudar a los menos afortunados que nosotros mismos (especialmente los pobres). Por lo tanto nuestro empleador merece nuestro mejor esfuerzo. Al ser perezoso o "matar el tiempo" es una injusticia a nuestro empleador y un delito contra nuestro Dios.
