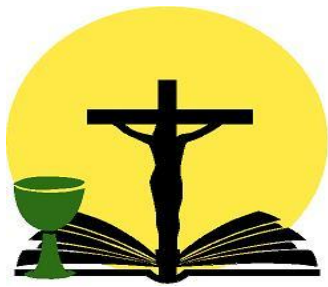

## At That Critical Moment

On the cross, when Jesus endured in his own flesh the dramatic encounter of the sin of the world and God's mercy, he could feel at his feet the consoling presence of his mother and his friend. At that crucial Moment, before fully accomplishing the work which his Father has entrusted to him, Jesus said to Mary: "Woman, here is your son." Then he said to his beloved friend: "Here is your mother."

These words of the dying Jesus are not chiefly the expression of his devotion and concern for his mother; rather, they are a revelatory formula which manifests the mystery of a special saving mission. Jesus left us his mother to be our Mother.

5. Our Adult Faith Formation Class is doing the Great Adventure 24-week Bible Study. Everyone is invited to join us, even if you did not sign up for the class. This is an adventure through the Bible and all are welcome.
6. Holy Land Olive Wood. Save some money for Holy Land Objects made of olive wood. At some time during the year this group will come to the church for sales. Their products are wonderful. All proceeds go to the support of needy families in Israel.
7. Building Improvement. The two HVAC units in the church have been replaced at a cost of \$5500. Remember this when the Building Maintenance envelope comes up for second mile giving. Our fund is down to \$4554. We are also buying another more efficient copy machine. It will pay for itself in about 5 years. Note, users will have to have a key code to use the machine. Every group will have a code. Cost of machine installation about \$2200. Balance in building maintenance fund down to \$2350.
