**Why you need Vitamin D:**

According to the Diabetic Focus magazine Vitamin D deficiency may be associated with peripheral neuropathy, a common complication of type 2 diabetes. Symptoms include numbness and tingling or prickling in your feet and/or hands. A recent study found the patients with peripheral neuropathy had significantly lower vitamin D blood levels and a higher prevalence of vitamin D deficiency than those without it. If you are diagnosed with Vitamin D deficiency, talk to your doctor about taking a supplement.

**Sunday Scripture Highlight**

**Rejoice, the Kingdom can be ours!**

Our Gospel passage, from Matthew, connects the prophecy of Isaiah to the arrival of Jesus, almost word for word. In this passage we find the imprisoned John the Baptist sending his disciples to ask Jesus if he is indeed the long-awaited Messiah. Jesus’ reply is almost identical to Isaiah’s prophetic words. He says, “Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, and the dead are raised...” The Savior really has arrived just as promised! But patience and firmness of heart are required as we await his perfect timing. Let us rejoice in the knowledge that God has called us to enter this kingdom. Let us keep our hearts firmly fixed on this eternal goal and strive with all our might to give God and others the very best of ourselves in gratitude for such a privilege.

**We can control our attitude**

Our first reading from the prophet Isaiah seems to shout out good cheer as he paints a picture of what the long-awaited Savior will usher in: “the eyes of the blind will be opened, the ears of the deaf will be cleared; then will the lame leap like a stag... the tongue of the mute will sing. Those whom the Lord has ransomed (that’s us!) will return and enter Zion singing, crowned with everlasting joy; they will meet with joy and gladness, sorrow and mourning will flee.” St. James, in our second reading, offers wise counsel. “Be patient, brothers and sisters, until the coming of the Lord... Make your hearts firm... Do not complain, brothers and sisters, about one another, that you may not be judged.” St. James reminds us that we can choose our response to both the great strains and the minor annoyances of life. In other words, we can be good stewards of our attitude, “making our hearts firm” by practicing patience with others and refusing to give in to the temptation to complain. We can choose to see and rejoice in God’s presence with us, no matter the circumstances surrounding us.
