Sunday Scriptural Stewardship Reflection

The stewardship way of life could be described as a daily pursuit of the kingdom of heaven. Today’s readings show us the critical importance of being wise in the ways of God in order to be able to set correct priorities in order to obtain it. In our First Reading, God appears to Solomon in a dream and invites Solomon to ask Him for something he desires. Rather than asking for riches or power, Solomon asks for the gift of “an understanding heart... to distinguish right from wrong.” In other words, he asks God to help him discern what is true and wise. God gave him this gift. This is why Solomon has been known since then as the wisest of kings. God will give the same gift to us if we ask Him sincerely. And in fact, we must have a wise and understanding heart if we are to live the stewardship way of life, to guide our priorities and decision making in matters big and small.

In our Gospel passage from Matthew today, we arrive at the conclusion of three weeks of Jesus’ teaching on the kingdom of heaven. In each of these stories, the kingdom of heaven is somewhat “hidden.” We must know how to search for it amidst the noise of the world that bombards us. We need wisdom to recognize it. But Jesus concludes again with a warning. “The angels will go out and separate the wicked from the righteous and throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth.” Let us, therefore, pray for the wisdom to recognize the kingdom of heaven in our midst and pursue it starting right now. There is no time to lose.
